I understand that it will be difficult for the staff as there are no criteria, which is something that the MFB have discussed before. A past student received this a couple of years ago as they were a standout example to the school. This student did a lot for World Vision including organising and hosting a talent show. The Principal actually approached us to see if we could recognise this student in some way.

It is this kind of thing that we would be looking for. It is not a case of 'here are some criteria for an award that must be presented', it is the other way around. 'Here is an exceptional student who has shone in a way that the school would like to recognise'.

If there isn't a standout person then there is no need to present an award.

Awarded to an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) student who...

- has shown consistent improvement in Language
e.g. most improved in English Oral Language

Science & Technology Trophy

Awarded to a student who...

- has consistently shown a high interest in these areas
- has demonstrated sound and creative investigative skills
- has produced work (written, oral, graphics, multimedia) that shows very good understanding.
- has entered a good exhibit in a science fair (if an opportunity has been provided).

Family Cups & Prizes

Founders' Cup:

The Founder's Cup was created by former Principal, Debbie Middleton, on behalf of her mother, Athalie Chapman. Mrs Chapman was the founding Principal of Maranatha Christian School, then known as Prospect House, from 1967 until 1983.

The Founder's Cup is awarded to a Year 7 or 8 student in recognition of outstanding attitude, effort and/or initiative across all areas of school life.

Oldham Family House Cup

The Oldham House Cup was gifted to the school by the Oldham family. Mr and Mrs Oldham were an elderly couple at the time the school opened and were among the first "Prayer Warriors" for Maranatha Christian School, then Prospect House. Their prayers of support and encouragement for the founding Principal during the early years of the school were greatly valued.

The Oldham House Cup is in recognition of the whānau group with the most points for the current year.

Awarded to Whānau Group Leader/s of the winning house.

Thorn Family Cup of Christian Service:

The Thorn Family have been associated with Maranatha Christian School from its beginning as Prospect House 51 years ago! Morry Thorn was involved in the construction of the first school buildings, served for many years as the Board Secretary and helped with the ongoing maintenance of the property. Nellie Thorn served voluntarily as a Parent Helper/Teacher Aide and then for many years as the school Librarian.

Over the years 3 of their children, 7 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren have attended, or currently attend, the school. A number have followed Morry & Nellie's example and served in various capacities including PTA and as a board member.

The Thorn family value the significance of 'Passing the Baton' to the next generation in order to ensure that God's good works continue at Maranatha Christian School and beyond.

Upton Family Cup of Christian Service:

The Upton Family were associated with Maranatha Christian School from 1980 through to 2001. Ron and Julie Upton had three sons, David, Andrew and Darren who completed their schooling at Maranatha. Julie was a teacher at the school from 1988 - 2001, and in the last few years was both Deputy Principal and Head of the Junior Syndicate. Ron supported the school in many ways including being a member of the PTA. Julie left Maranatha to go into the mission field with Ron.

The Family Upton Cup is in recognition of Christian Service.

- shown the Fruit of the Spirit through their daily interactions with others.

Sophie Beveridge Memorial Cup:

Sophie was a student at Maranatha Christian School from New Entrant to Year 6. Sophie was born with many challenges, however, she never let these define her. Sophie was an example of faith in action, joy in adversity and she was a much-loved member of the school community. Soon after leaving Maranatha, Sophie passed away unexpectedly. A kowhai tree was planted at school, with a plaque at the base, in remembrance of her.

The Sophie Beveridge Memorial Cup is awarded to any student for showing courage and determination throughout the year.

Bhawan Family Leadership Cup:

The Bhawan Family were associated with Maranatha Christian School from 2008 - 2017. During that time both Sandy and Sanjay served on the Board of Trustees as members and chairpersons while their children, Mysha and Aryav, completed their schooling at Maranatha.

The Bhawan Cup is in recognition of the importance of Godly Leaders, as described in our school vision “Growing Christ-Centered Learners and Leaders”. It acknowledges leadership contributions to the Student Council at Maranatha Christian School.

- made contributions to School Governance through involvement and participation with the School Board of Trustees (From 2019)
